# **Guidelines for Abstract Structure**

#### **Abstract structure**

Your abstract must be between 2,500 – 3,500 characters (including spaces).

#### 1. Title

The title of the abstract should reflect the content as accurately as possible.

## 2. Introduction, Motivation and Research Question

This section should briefly introduce the topic and outline the motivation for developing or implementing the software or an organizational approach. It may also include research questions that will be addressed and potentially answered in the presentation.

## 3. Materials, Methods and Tools

This section should briefly present the methods and tools used for analysis, selection, implementation, or realization.

#### 4. Description of the Solution (Application Software / Concept for Implementation)

This section should describe the application software or the key functions relevant to the presentation. A brief overview of the complete functionality can also be included. For presentations that introduce conceptual approaches (e.g., implementation or organizational concepts), this section should present those concepts in detail.

# 5. Results, Experiences and "Lessons Learned"

A core objective of the congress is to inform participants about specific topics and share experiences with software products, documentation methods, and organizational concepts. Aligned with this goal, this chapter represents the heart of what should be communicated to the field. Every participant should return with new insights and experiences. This section should therefore describe the current status achieved through the presented solution, the experiences made during selection, implementation, and operation, and the lessons learned. What should other users who are planning a similar project definitely take into account? Keep in mind that as a speaker, you are the expert who can competently support the audience in tackling their challenges through your DMEA contribution.

## 6. Discussion and Outlook

This section should critically reflect on the results and achievements and provide an outlook on further project development and future plans.
