 - Strategic goal: To be among the top 10 in the DESI-Ranking.

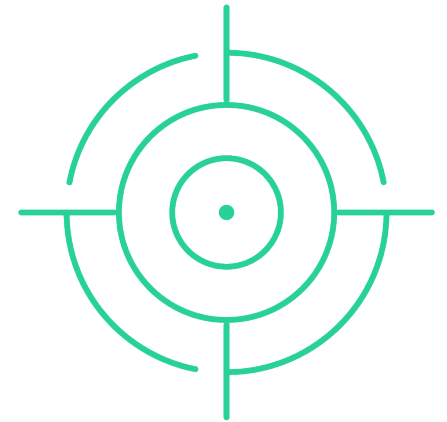

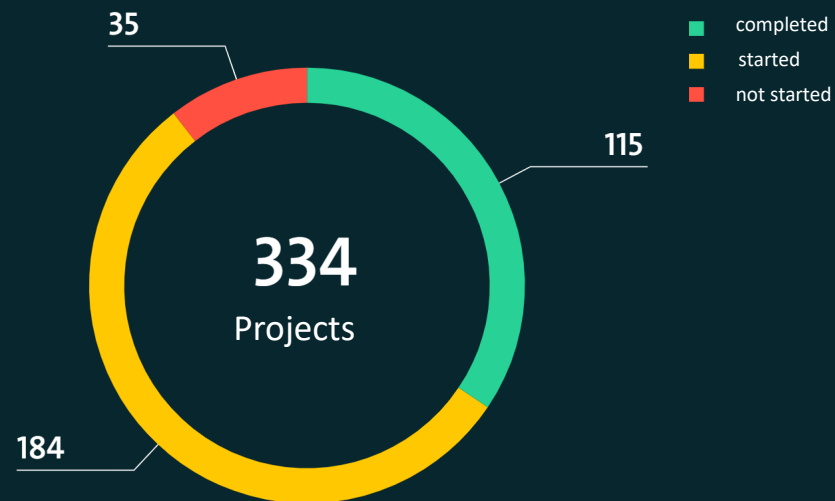

From Strategy to Action: Current Initiatives

- **Online Access Act 2.0 (OZG 2.0):** The aim of the online access act was to have all government services available online by the end of 2022. This goal was missed. The OZG 2.0 is intended to catch up as a follow-up act.
- **Modernization of Registers:** Aims to create a central component system, known as the Once-Only-Technical-System (NOOTS). Modern registers are the basis for delivering administrative services to citizens and businesses digitally and for making government processes more efficient.
- **Smart City Action Plan (“Stufenplan”):** Aims to support cities and municipalities in Germany with their digital transformation by introducing a marketplace and a competence center.
- **MPSC Funding Program:** Supports municipalities in Germany in the implementation of digital transformation projects by providing funding. It focuses on enhancing digital infrastructure, modernizing public services, and promoting smart city initiatives.

The Case for a Digital State

- **Climate Goals Drive Digital Sustainability Strategies:** Achieving climate targets requires data-driven solutions and digital infrastructure that enable local governments to monitor, manage, and optimize sustainability efforts efficiently.
- **The Pandemic Redefined Digital Living and Working:** The COVID-19 pandemic accelerated the need for digital transformation in how we live and work. A digital state ensures the adoption of remote services, digital education, and e-government solutions to adapt to these new realities.
- **Urbanization Demands Smart, Digital Solutions:** As cities grow, a digital state can leverage IoT, AI, and smart city technologies to improve infrastructure, enhance mobility, and deliver public services that are efficient, sustainable, and scalable.

München Defends Top Spot

Leading in Digital Infrastructure, Strong in Administration

- The Bavarian state capital defends its first place and increases the lead over Hamburg.
- In the category of IT and Telecommunications, Munich ranks first, with 100 percent 5G coverage and nearly nationwide gigabit internet. It is also highly advanced in fiber-optic and LoRaWAN expansion. Through open-data and geoportals, a wide range of data is made available, and a "digitalization radar" shows the status of all digitalization projects.
- Munich also excels in other categories: 2nd place in administration, 3rd place in society and education, and 4th place in the mobility category.
- Pilot project "Connected Urban Twins" (with Hamburg and Leipzig).
- Pilot project "MUCGPT" (AI-based language assistant for municipal employees).

E-Government Best Practice: AI in Action

F13 in Baden-Württemberg

In Baden-Württemberg, the use of artificial intelligence in public administration is being promoted with the "F13" project.

- F13 is the first prototype based on a large-scale AI language model in German public administration, providing AI support for employees when working with text.
- Functions:
 - Summarizing texts
 - Providing answers to state policy research questions and deliver text modules for creating documents.
 - Converting extensive cabinet documents into concise notes.
 - Assisting in answering state policy research questions.
 - Training staff. The prototype allows employees to explore generative AI not only in their personal lives, but also in their professional environment.

F13 is a cooperation between InnoLab_bw and AlephAlpha, a member of Bitkom.
